


Study Area



East Branch Early Action Study Area



- Tributary of Newtown Creek
- Approximately 0.5 miles in length
- Surface area ~11 acres
- Depth 10.3-16.5 ft in channel and shallower at head of tributaries
- Extensive investigations completed as part of the Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study Process
- Focused Feasibility Study (FFS)
 was developed to evaluate
 remedial alternatives for the East
 Branch

Draft FFS Comment Categorization Approach

- The Schedule is very tight and will take close coordination and cooperation to achieve.
- To help expedite the schedule, EPA suggested the use of a "Categorization Approach" to address the more than 300 comments submitted on the July 2023 Draft FFS report and produce deliverables in a timely manner.

Category 1

- The concern needs to be addressed before CSTAG Meeting No. 4 to inform EPA's preliminary recommendation of the preferred alternative and our ability to support this determination to CSTAG
- Also includes comments related to key topics that should either be resolved prior to going into the CSTAG meeting or discussed with CSTAG.

Category 2

• The concern needs to be addressed before the FFS and Proposed Plan are released for formal public comment.

Category 3

 The comment can be held for the remedial design and does not need to be addressed in the FFS.

Key Topics

- Non-aqueous phase liquids (NAPL) and in-situ stabilization (ISS)
 - NAPL mobility
 - Options for treating NAPL
 - ISS as a common element of all alternatives
- Uplands and CERCLA Policy/ARARS/Water Quality
 - Seeps
 - Sealed bulkheads as a common element of all alternatives
 - Ongoing source control authority and role of background
 - Climate change and resiliency
 - Navigation
- Alternative Descriptions and Flexibility in Design
 - Dredging
 - Capping
- Detailed Analysis of Alternatives
 - Long- and short-term effectiveness
 - Post-implementation monitoring
 - Metrics
